**Call to Worship**

**Psalm 100**

(The Lord calls us as his people to worship him- to bring him praise and thanksgiving. This psalm also reminds us that the Lord is good and faithful)

**Psalm 100**

Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth.

**Worship the Lord with gladness;  
come before Him with joyful songs.**

Know that the Lord is God.

**It is He who made us, and we are His;  
we are His people, the sheep of His pasture.**

Enter His gates with thanksgiving and  
His courts with praise;

**give thanks to Him and praise His name.**

For the Lord is good and His love endures forever;

**His faithfulness continues through all generations.**

**Confession of Faith** (Note: select the Shorter Catechism OR the Heidelberg Catechism, whichever is appropriate for your setting)

**Westminster Shorter Catechism (In Modern English), Questions 1-5**

*Q. 1. What is man's primary purpose?*

**A.1. Man's primary purpose is to glorify God and to enjoy Him forever.**

*Q. 2. What authority from God directs us how to glorify and enjoy Him?*

**A.2. The only authority for glorifying and enjoying Him is the bible, which is the word of God and is made up of the Old and New Testaments.**

*Q. 3. What does the bible primarily teach?*

**A.3. The Bible primarily teaches what man must believe about God and what God requires of man.**

*Q. 4. What is God?*

**A. 4. God is a spirit, Whose being, wisdom, power, holiness, justice, goodness, and truth are infinite, eternal, and unchangeable.**

*Q. 5. Is there more than one God?*

**A.5. There is only one, the living and true God.**

**The Heidelberg Catechism, Question 1**

**Q. What is your only comfort in life and in death?**

A. That I am not my own,<sup>1</sup>  
but belong—  
body and soul,<sup>2</sup>  
in life and in death—  
to my faithful saviour Jesus Christ.<sup>3</sup>  
He has fully paid for all my sins with His precious blood,<sup>4</sup>  
and has set me free from the tyranny of the devil.<sup>5</sup>  
He also watches over me in such a way<sup>6</sup>  
that not a hair can fall from my head

without the will of my Father in heaven;<sup>7</sup>  
in fact, all things must work together for my salvation.<sup>8</sup>  
Because I belong to Him,  
Christ, by His Holy Spirit,<sup>9</sup>  
assures me of eternal life  
and makes me whole-heartedly willing and ready<sup>10</sup>  
from now on to live for Him.

## **Prayer**

(No matter what the ages, try to be brief, Christ-centered, and invite others to participate. Consider following the pattern of the Lord's Prayer:)

- a. "Hallow God"- praise Him for his holiness and his character
- b. Pray for the kingdom- for our souls to be transformed, for the work of our churches, and for the transformation of our communities
- c. Give thanks for our daily bread- for all of the ways the Lord sustains us- and pray for those who are in need of mercy, healing, and hope
- d. Ask the Lord to forgive our sins and to help us by his Spirit to resist the temptation of Satan
- e. Give thanks to God for his glory and give Him thanks for answering our prayers

(Note: this is also a good time for you and your family to pray about the particular ministries He is calling you to. If you don't know what these are, it would be a great time to ask the Lord to show you what it is that He wants you to do. There are ample opportunities in our community for us to express the love of Christ in deeds of love and mercy.)

### Scripture Reading

(Note: you can select a favorite passage here; really, any passage is fine. I've selected Psalm 19, because as I write this I'm watching the incredible glory of the Lord revealed in a snowstorm. Verses 1-6 of this Psalm talk about *General Revelation*, the way that God reveals Himself through nature and His creation; and verses 7-14 speak of *Special Revelation*, the way that God reveals Himself and His plan for salvation through His holy Word.)

### Psalm 19

#### ***For the director of music. A psalm of David.***

- <sup>1</sup> The heavens declare the glory of God;  
the skies proclaim the work of his hands.
- <sup>2</sup> Day after day they pour forth speech;  
night after night they display knowledge.
- <sup>3</sup> There is no speech or language  
where their voice is not heard. <sup>[a]</sup>
- <sup>4</sup> Their voice <sup>[b]</sup> goes out into all the earth,  
their words to the ends of the world.  
In the heavens he has pitched a tent for the sun,
- <sup>5</sup> which is like a bridegroom coming forth from his pavilion,  
like a champion rejoicing to run his course.
- <sup>6</sup> It rises at one end of the heavens  
and makes its circuit to the other;  
nothing is hidden from its heat.
- <sup>7</sup> The law of the LORD is perfect,  
reviving the soul.  
The statutes of the LORD are trustworthy,  
making wise the simple.
- <sup>8</sup> The precepts of the LORD are right,  
giving joy to the heart.

The commands of the LORD are radiant,  
giving light to the eyes.

<sup>9</sup> The fear of the LORD is pure,  
enduring forever.  
The ordinances of the LORD are sure  
and altogether righteous.

<sup>10</sup> They are more precious than gold,  
than much pure gold;  
they are sweeter than honey,  
than honey from the comb.

<sup>11</sup> By them is your servant warned;  
in keeping them there is great reward.

<sup>12</sup> Who can discern his errors?  
Forgive my hidden faults.

<sup>13</sup> Keep your servant also from willful sins;  
may they not rule over me.  
Then will I be blameless,  
innocent of great transgression.

<sup>14</sup> May the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart  
be pleasing in your sight,  
O LORD, my Rock and my Redeemer.
